## Post-Dorian Recovery efforts successful at Parks Canada places in Prince Edward Island

**Charlottetown, PE, January 31, 2020** – Today, Parks Canada shared a status update of the recovery efforts at Parks Canada sites in Prince Edward Island that were damaged by post-tropical storm Dorian in September 2019.

The rehabilitation of affected areas (including Cavendish Campground) continues and is proceeding well, with Parks Canada’s current focus on the removal of forest debris. Planning is underway for landscaping in the spring and fall of 2020, which will include replanting of trees and shrubs where required.

The success of these recovery efforts, thanks to the dedication of team members and the community, allows Parks Canada to confirm that both **Cavendish and Stanhope campgrounds will reopen in June 2020 as planned.**

The following work is planned from now through the spring of 2020:

	Robinsons Island Road	Addition of materials to rebuild road shoulder
<b>PEI National Park - Throughout</b>	Affected areas of shoreline	Marram grass planting and sand trap construction (late spring, early summer)
<b>Green Gables Heritage Place</b>	Balsam Hollow Brook Trail	Removal of excess vegetation and rebuilding bridges as well as portions of the trail  <i>Please note <u>this trail will be closed until work has been completed (June 2020).</u></i>
