PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND NATIONAL PARK SEASONAL PASSES NOW AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AND EARLY BIRD PRICING IN EFFECT UNTIL JUNE 15

Charlottetown, PEI, June 4, 2020 – Seasonal passes to Prince Edward Island National Park are now available for purchase and early bird pricing will be available until June 15.

Visitors are encouraged to purchase their passes online at www.parksorders.ca. Please note that with increased volume and mail and package delivery service at this time, Parks Canada will temporarily accept printed email confirmations that show a valid entry pass or permit purchased online.

Parks Canada is working to ensure that measures are in place to safely collect fees and protect the health of employees and visitors. In-person purchasing for PEI National Park seasonal passes will be available and priced as follows:

- \$17.48 for a senior (age 65+)
- \$20.03 for an adult (age 18-64)
- \$50.08 for family/group of up to seven people in one vehicle

A further announcement will be made soon about when passes can be purchased in person at entrance gates to PEI National Park.

Discovery Passes are also available for sale [online](#). For current pass holders, Parks Canada will automatically extend the end date of Discovery Passes for the full duration of the suspension period. For visitors who hold a Discovery Pass which was valid in March 2020, Parks Canada will automatically extend the end date of these Discovery Passes by four months. This covers the three-month suspension of visitor services, plus the gradual resumption of visitor services during the month of June.

Visiting PEI National Park and national historic sites this season will be different than it has been in the past. Parks Canada is asking visitors to plan ahead by checking the PEI National Park and national historic sites websites before they travel for information on what locations are open, what visitors can expect, how to prepare for their visit and what services may be available.
